#### **TODAY'S READINGS**

# **Entrance Antiphon:**

If you, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But with you is found forgiveness, O God of Israel.

# First Reading: 2 Kings 5:14-17

Naaman the leper went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, as Elisha had told him to do. And his flesh became clean once more like the flesh of a little child. Returning to Elisha with his whole escort, he went in and stood before him. 'Now I know' he said 'that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel. Now, please, accept a present from your servant.' But Elisha replied, 'As the Lord lives, whom I serve, I will accept nothing.' Naaman pressed him to accept, but he refused. Then Naaman said, 'Since your answer is "No," allow your servant to be given as much earth as two mules may carry, because your servant will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any god except the Lord.'

### Responsorial Psalm: 97:1-4

The Lord has revealed to the nations his saving power.

# Second Reading: 2 Timothy 2:8-13

Remember the Good News that I carry, 'Jesus Christ risen from the dead, sprung from the race of David'; it is on account of this that I have my own hardships to bear, even to being chained like a criminal – but they cannot chain up God's news. So I bear it all for the sake of those who are chosen, so that in the end they may have the salvation that is in Christ Jesus and the eternal glory that comes with it. Here is a saying that you can rely on: If we have died with him, then we shall live with him. If we hold firm, then we shall reign with him. If we disown him, then he will disown us. We may be unfaithful, but he is always faithful, for he cannot disown his own self.

#### **Gospel Acclamation:**

Alleluia, alleluia!

For all things give thanks to God, because this is what he expects of you in Christ Jesus. Alleluia!

#### Gospel: Luke 17:11-19

On the way to Jerusalem Jesus travelled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As he entered one of the villages, ten lepers came to meet him. They stood some way off and called to him, 'Jesus! Master! Take pity on us.' When he saw them he said, 'Go and show yourselves to the priests.' Now as they were going away they were cleansed. Finding himself cured, one of them turned back praising God at the top of his voice and threw himself at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. The man was a Samaritan. This made Jesus say, 'Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they? It seems that no one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.' And he said to the man, 'Stand up and go on your way. Your faith has saved vou.'

# Reflection:

**First Reading (2 Kings 5:14-17).** On being cured of leprosy, Naaman comes to believe in the true God, and is lavish in his gratitude towards the prophet Elisha.

**Second Reading (2 Timothy 2:8-13).** Paul tells Timothy that the work of preaching the Gospel will result in hardship, opposition and persecution.

**Gospel (Luke 17:11-19).** The story of ten people who were cured of leprosy by Jesus, and how only one came back to thank him.

The First Reading tells how on being cured of leprosy Naaman acknowledges Yahweh as the supreme and only God. However, when he tries to express his gratitude to Elisha, the prophet refuses to accept it, because it would suggest that the cure was due to him rather than to God. As commander of the

This story prepares us for the Gospel account of the cure of

ten lepers by Jesus, and how only one of them, a foreigner (a Samaritan), came back to thank him.

Syrian army, Naaman was a Gentile.

The stranger puts the Jews to shame. His reaction anticipates the glad reception of the Good News by the Samaritans in Acts 8:1-25.



#### October: the month of the Rosary

The month of October is dedicated to the Mother of God under the title of Our Lady of the Rosary, usually celebrated by the Church on the 7<sup>th</sup>. This commemoration was established in 1573 in thanksgiving for a Christian victory over the Ottoman forces at Lepanto. It entered the general calendar in the 18th century. It is a memorial of the Virgin Mary as honoured in the rosary.

Originally the rosary was the laity's "psalter," the Hail Marys replacing the 150 psalms.

May they have the satisfaction of achieving their personal best and feel your loving presence in their lives, now and always.


